

Diagnostic Wax-Ups

We are trying to improve our communication process in helping you see how much to prepare the teeth in order to achieve the results shown in the wax-up.

You will receive a model with some teeth marked in red and other teeth with beige wax on them (see photos 1a & 1b).

The red is to indicate where reduction is needed prior to bringing the teeth into alignment with the rest of the teeth.

The beige wax is to show where we added to the teeth to bring them into alignment; from this model you would be able to tell which teeth will need more tooth reduction (marked red) and which teeth you can be more conservative (beige wax) with.

From here we do a prep model showing the needed reduction (see photo 2).

The reduction stints will aid in how much tooth structure to remove (see photos 3a-d).

We will proceed with the diagnostic wax-up from the prep model to give us the final results (see photos 4a & 4b).

The benefits of doing a diagnostic wax-up is it gives the patient a visual chance to see

their before teeth and what their teeth could look like.

When they can see and hold the models it becomes a powerful tool in helping them to become more willing to go forward with the prescribed treatment plan.

We provide a silicone matrix to make beautiful temporaries that look just like the wax-up (see photo 5).

This gives us a trial run to make sure the patient likes the shape, length, color, and function of the temps.

If changes are made to the temporaries, please take an impression of those temps to fabricate the final restorations. This will help to insure no big surprises from temps to finals.

Please send the wax-up back along with the pre-op models to help in fabricating the final restorations.

Some other important reminders are to include a stick bite, photos, and specific instructions regarding the shape and length of the teeth.

We know this will help in achieving the beautiful smiles that you have come to expect from us here at Treasure Dental Lab.
